
#### Methodology

The analysis in this report is based on results of a survey conducted from Thursday, May 26th to Saturday, May 28th, 2022, among a sample of 387 adults, 18 years of age or older, living in Ontario. The survey was conducted using automated telephone interviews (Smart IVR). Respondents were interviewed on landlines and cellular phones. The survey is intended to represent the voting population in Thunder Bay Atikokan.

The margin of error for the poll is +/- 5% at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are higher in each subsample.

## If the provincial election were held today, how would you vote? (all voters)







## If the provincial election were held today, how would you vote? (leaning voters with undecided totals)






