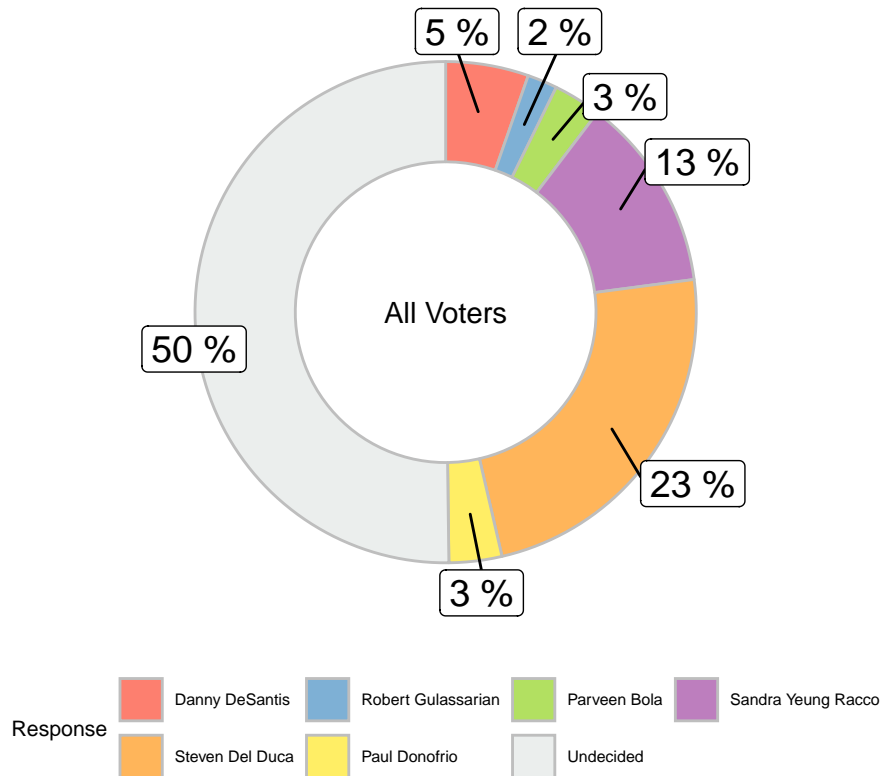
Methodology

The analysis in this report is based on results of a survey conducted from Thursday, October 13th to Monday, October 17th, 2022, among a sample of 452 adults, 18 years of age or older, living in Vaughan. The survey was conducted using automated telephone interviews (Smart IVR). Respondents were interviewed on landlines and cellular phones. The survey is intended to represent the voting population in Vaughan.

The margin of error for the poll is +/- 4.6% at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are higher in each subsample.

In the upcoming Mayoral Election in your city, which candidate are you leaning towards voting for? (all voters, Vaughan)



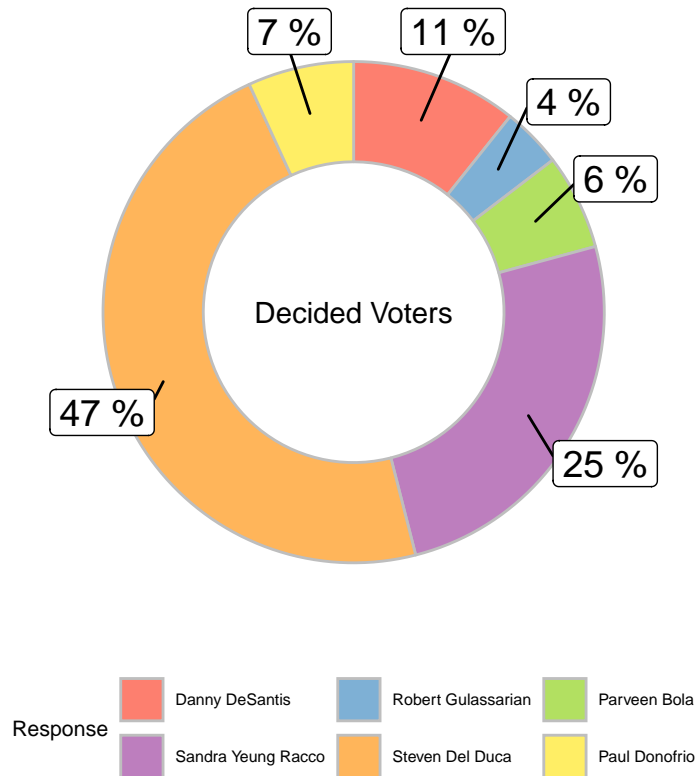

In the upcoming Mayoral Election in your city, which candidate are you leaning towards voting for? (Decided Voters, Vaughan)





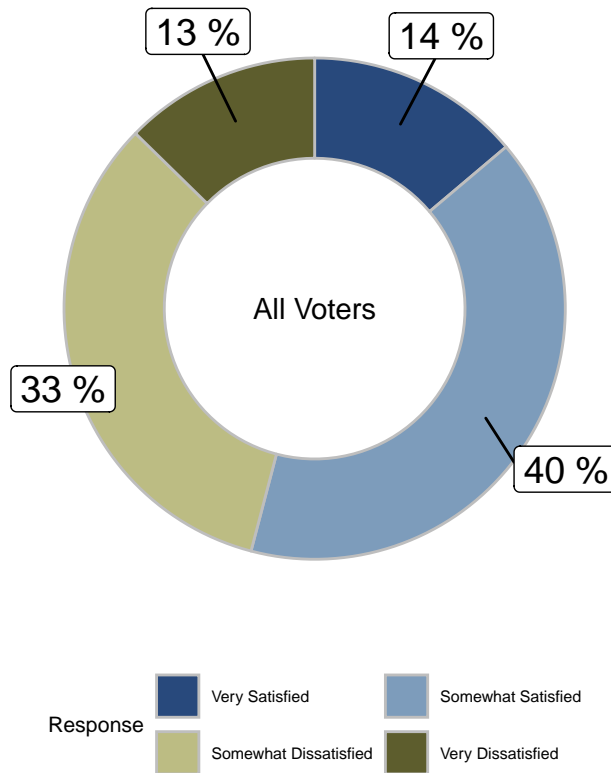

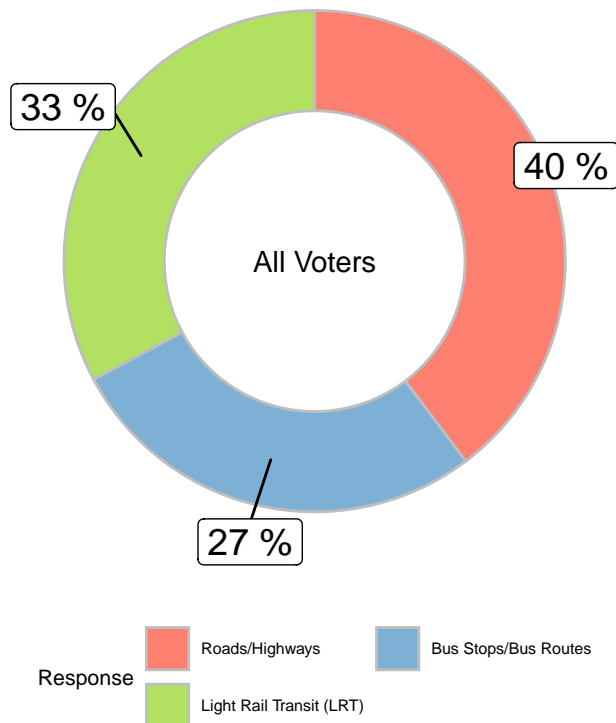
