Methodology

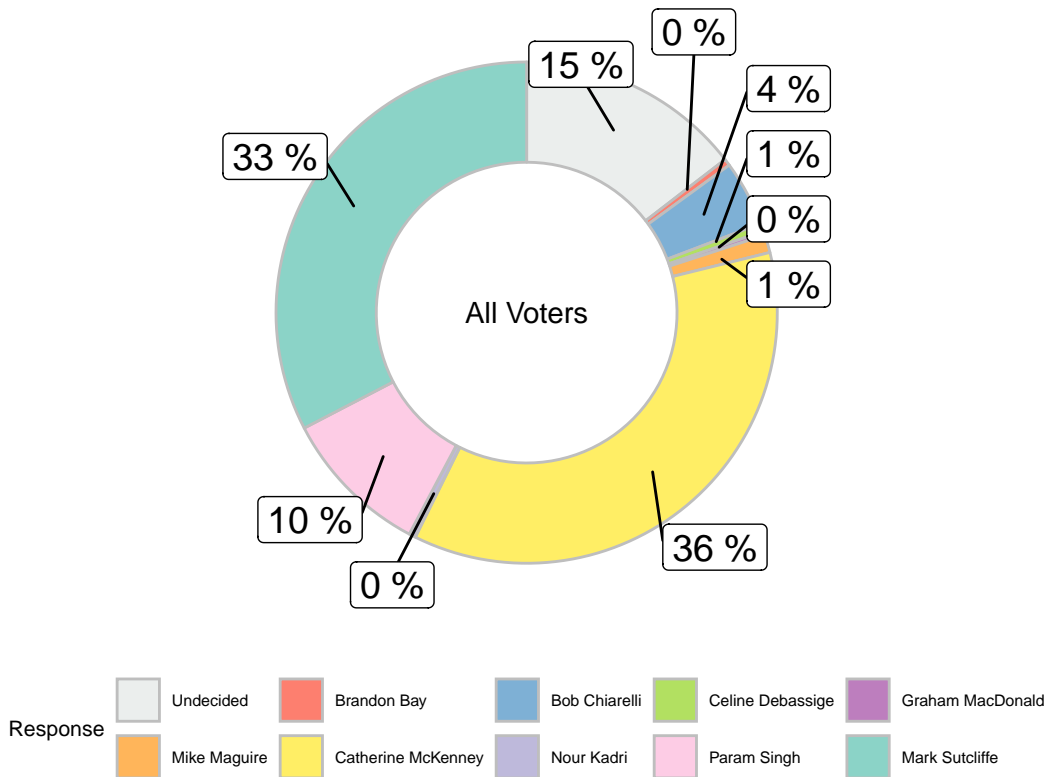
The analysis in this report is based on results of a survey conducted from Tuesday, October 18th to Wednesday, October 19th, 2022, among a sample of 1079 adults, 18 years of age or older, living in Ottawa. The survey was conducted using automated telephone interviews (Smart IVR) and the Probit Probability Panel (online). Respondents were interviewed on landlines and cellular phones and online. The survey is intended to represent the voting population in Ottawa.

The margin of error for the poll is +/- 3% at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are higher in each subsample.

Totals may not add up 100% due to rounding.

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In the upcoming Mayoral Election in your city, which candidate are you leaning towards voting for? (all voters, Ottawa)



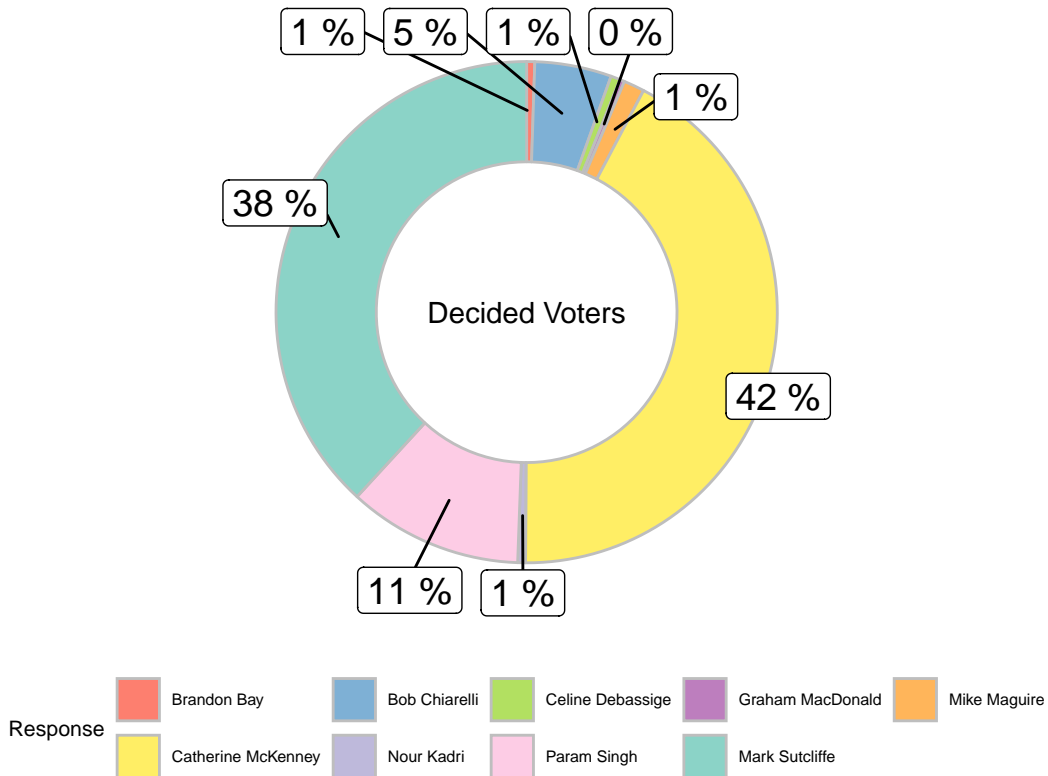

In the upcoming Mayoral Election in your city, which candidate are you leaning towards voting for? (Decided Voters, Ottawa)



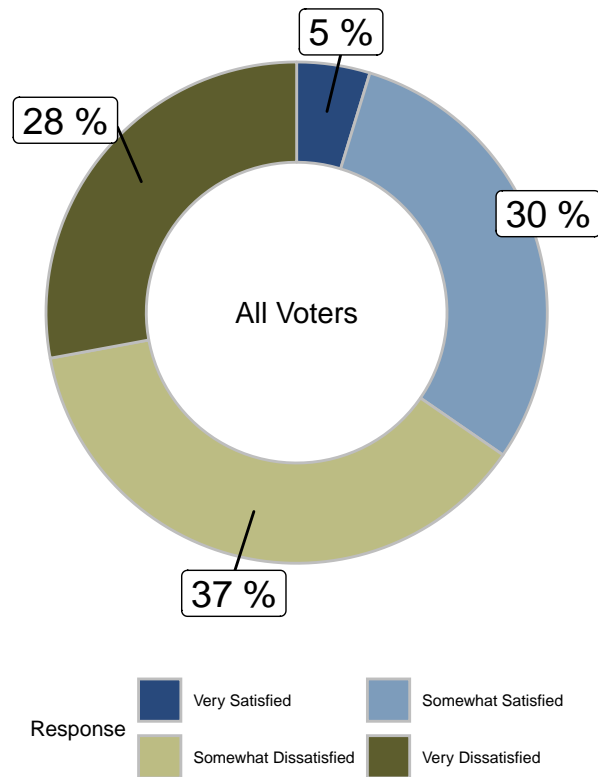

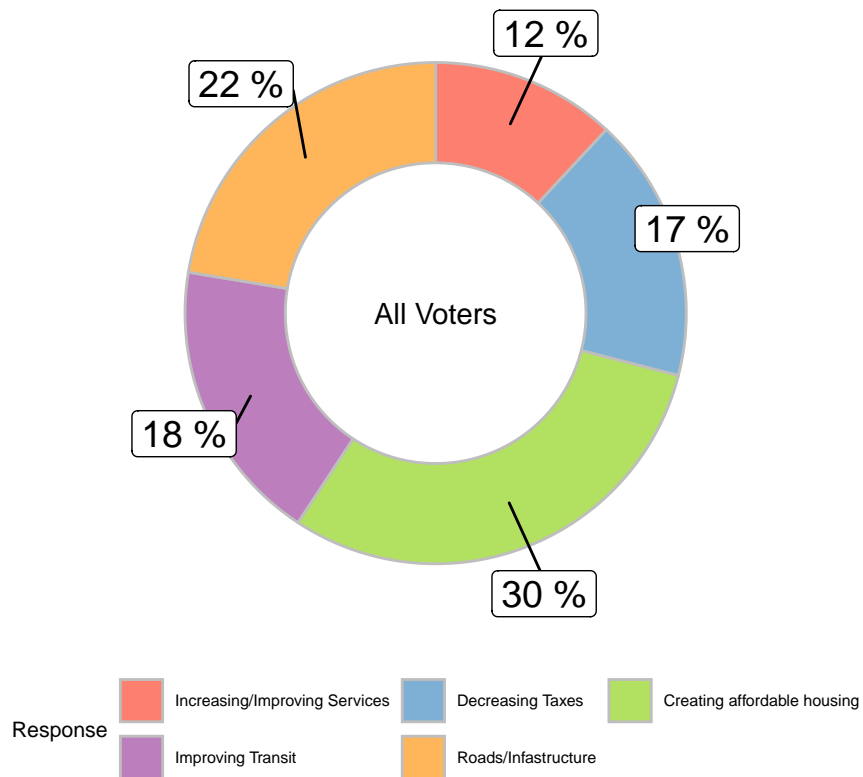
